# By the end

At the end is most commonly used literally, as a prepositional phrase followed by of, to refer to the end of a specific noun. This noun can be a physical object, a period of time, an event, a place, or something more abstract, such as one's patience.

- At the end of his life, he had no regrets.
- Put a period at the end of every sentence.
- I pay the phone bill at the end of each month.

In the end is used mostly as an idiom that means "finally," "after a long time," or, "when everything is considered." It is often followed by a comma. Here are some sentences with this idiom:

- We worked hard, and in the end, we achieved our goal.
- In the end, what really matters in a friendship is trust.
- In the end, she chose to go to Oberlin College.

The phrase "by the end" tells us that something happened/will happen before the ending of something. It suggests the idea of 'progress up to a particular time'.

- By the end of the day we had sold over 2,000 tickets
- The construction will be completed **by the end** of the year.
- **By the end** of the meeting we solved the problem.

#### At the end of the day (phrase)

something that you say before you give the most important fact of a situation:

- Of course I'll listen to what she has to say but at the end of the day, it's my decision.
- At the end of the day, the board's not going to be concerned with three or four more dollars.

### At the end vs By the end

Notice the difference between the following sentences:

- The baby made a huge mess at the end of the party. [=during the final moments of the party]
- The baby made a huge mess by the end of the party.

[=the baby had been making a mess for the whole party, and when the party ended, the mess was huge]

- At the end of the meeting we solved the problem. [=during the last minutes/moments of the meeting]
- By the end of the meeting we solved the problem.

[=we worked throughout the meeting to find a solution, and when the meeting ended we had a solution]
