SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVES/ADVERBS

We do not use <i>the</i> with superlatives when we compare <u>the same person or thing</u>	
DEFINITIVE ARTICLE	NO DEFINITIVE
IS OPTIONAL	ARTICLE
Comparing different people / things	Comparing the same person / thing
	in different situations
✓ Of all my friends,	✓ He's nicest when he's
he's (the) nicest.	with children.
\checkmark She works (the) hardest in	\checkmark She works hardest when
the family; her husband	she's doing something

\checkmark All of those people run very	✓ He runs fastest
fast, but he runs (the) fastest.	in the morning.

SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVES

When a superlative adjective is followed by a noun, we normally use **the**:

- It's **the best book** I've ever read.
- This is **the best meal** I've had for a long time.

After linking verbs, superlative adjectives also usually have the, though it is sometimes dropped in an informal style.

- Which of the boys is (the) strongest?
- This dictionary is **(the)** best.
- She is (the) most beautiful.

The cannot be dropped when a superlative is used with a defining expression.

- ✓ This dictionary is **the** best I could find.
- X This dictionary is best I could find.

SUPERLATIVE ADVERBS

The is sometimes dropped before superlative adverbs in an informal style.

- Who can run (**the**) fastest?
- I like vanilla ice cream (the) best.
