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Hand in Entregar / abgeben

To give something to a someone in authority.

- Remember to hand in the keys when you leave the hotel.
- I have to <u>hand in</u> my essay by Friday.
- Mike has resigned. He's handed in his resignation this morning.



Hand out Repartir / austeilen

To give something to different people in a group.

- Can you help me to hand out these leaflets?
- The teacher **handed out** the test papers to the students.
- A waiter was <u>handing out</u> drinks to the guests.



Hand over

Entregar / übergeben

- 1) To give something to somebody by holding it in your hand and offering it to them
 - At the airport, I was asked to **hand over** my passport.
 - John handed the phone over to me.
- 2) To give someone the control or responsibility over something.
 - Hold on a second and I'll <u>hand</u> you <u>over</u> to someone who might be able to help you.
 - The responsibility for rebuilding the team was handed over to the new manager.
