Lay claim to something (formal)

atribuirse algo / ein Anspruch auf etwas erheben

If you lay claim to something, you say that it belongs to you or that you deserve it.

- Mobile operator Three UK has <u>laid claim to</u> the title of the UK's fastest growing network, adding one million customers in the last year.
- The city can <u>lay claim to</u> having the oldest Church in Britain.

Lay it on (a bit) thick (informal)

Exagerar/ pasarse un poco / übertreiben / zu dick auftragen

To exaggerate something in order to try to impress or to praise someone to much.

- I think he laid it on a bit thick with all the compliments.
- Make sure he is flattered, but don't lay it on too thick.

Lay down the law (informal)

sentar las reglas /ein Machtwort sprechen

to forcefully tell somebody what to do in a way that shows that you expect them to obey you completely

- Who do you think you are? You can't just come into my office and start laying down the law.
- With these kids, you have to lay down the law and establish your authority.

Lay down your life for something (formal)

dar la vida por algo / das Leben für etwas opfern.

to die for something you believe in strongly:

- Today, we are here to remember those who laid down their lives for our country.
- He was willing to **lay down his life** for his beliefs.
