MISTAKES WITH "NEARLY"

- 122. X I nearly never go to the cinema.
 - ✓ I almost never go to the cinema.
 - √ I hardly ever go to the cinema.
- 123. X I nearly ever go to work on Sundays.
 - ✓ I almost never go to work on Sundays.
 - √ I hardly ever go to work on Sundays.

More examples:

- X I was disappointed because nearly no-one came to my art exhibition.
- ✓ I was disappointed because almost no-one came to my art exhibition.
- X There's nearly nothing in the fridge so I'd better go shopping.
- √ There's almost nothing in the fridge so I'd better go shopping.
- X Nearly none of the original hardware is still in service.
- ✓ Almost none of the original hardware is still in service.

Nearly is not often used with 'never', 'no-one', 'nobody', 'nowhere', 'nothing', 'no' and 'none'. Instead, we use 'almost', or we use 'hardly' with a non-negative form.

Incorrect:

Nearly never, Nearly nobody, Nearly nowhere, Nearly nothing, Nearly none, Nearly no

Correct:

Almost never, Almost nobody, Almost nowhere, Almost nothing, Almost none, Almost no

A good mnemonic is to remember that Nearly starts with an "N" and all negative forms start also with an "N".
