OF vs FROM vs BY

OF

We use "OF" to say who something belongs to, and to express the idea of being part of something

- The house of our neighbours.
- She was driving the car of a friend.
- The lead singer of the band.

FROM

We use "FROM" to state who gives, sends or provides something

- He wanted an apology from the salesman.
- Have a read of our reviews and success stories <u>from</u> real students.
- Are you searching for a book from a specific bookseller?

BY

We use "BY" to say who created something (, i.e. wrote a book, painted a picture, etc.)

- A novel by John Smith.
- A painting by Picasso.
- A design <u>by</u> Edward Johnston.

Example:

The book <u>of</u> John's. (= The book belongs to John)
The book <u>by</u> John. (= The book was written by John)
The book from John. (= John provided us with the book)
