- She sat back for a minute to **ponder** her next move in the game.
- He continued to **ponder** the problem as he walked home.

ponder on/over/about

• The university board is still **pondering** over the matter.

ponder how/what/whether

- Jay stood still for a moment,
 pondering whether to go or not.
- I'm continually **pondering how** to improve the team.

Pander to phrasal verb

To do or say what someone wants in order to please them, even though you know it is not right.

- The government was accused of **pandering to** racial prejudice.
- Some newspapers feel they have to **pander to** the prejudices of their readers.
- It's not good the way she **panders to** his every whim.
- Political leaders almost inevitably pander to big business.
