QUITE A FEW (also a good few/not a few):

(used with plural countable nouns)

A fairly large number

- I know **quite a few** people who have had the same problem.
- **Quite a few** towns are now banning cars from their shopping centres.
- She must have cooked a **good few** dinners over the years.
- There were hundreds of protesters, **not a few** of whom were women.

There were quite a lot of people waiting!



QUITE A LOT (also a good lot of):

(used with both countable and uncountable nouns)

A fairly large number or amount.

- My life has changed **quite a lot** since I went back to school.
- They drank **quite a lot of** wine.
- My job involves **quite a lot of** travel.

QUITE A BIT (also a good bit):

(used with uncountable nouns)

A fairly large amount or to a fairly large degree.

- He knows **quite a bit** about painting.
- I expect you do **quite a bit of** travelling?
- It took me **quite a bit of** time to read this book.
- They're worth **quite a bit more** than I thought.
- She's **quite a bit older** than you, isn't she?
