Parallel addition vs confirmation/surprise

Note the difference between :

- I have a beautiful house and **so have you**. (parallel addition)
- A: I have a beautiful house. B: **So you have**! (confirmation or surprise)

<u>so+auxiliary verb+subject:</u>

It is an inverted sentence because the auxiliary verb is before the subject. Translated as: also /too.

- 'You're a fool.' '**So are you.**' (=You are too.)
- He is doing very well at work. So is she. (=She is too.)
- Mary visits us quite often. So does Mike. (=Mike does too.)
- I've got a new car. **So have I**. (=Me too.)

<u>so+subject+auxiliary verb:</u>

it is a declarative sentence, which plays an emphatic role, translated as: indeed / I agree

- 'I think I'm right.' '**So you are**.' (=You are indeed right.)
- She is wearing that funny hat again!- So she is! (=It's true that she is wearing that funny hat again.)
- Mike looks just like his father. So he does! (=I agree that he looks just like his father.)
- I've got something in my eye. **So you have**! (=That's right; you have sth in you eye.)
