Exclamations with WHAT and HOW

We use exclamations to express surprise or shock or a strong emotion about something. The type of phrase or clause associated with exclamations is called exclamative. We usually form exclamatives with WHAT or HOW. In writing, we usually put an exclamation mark (!) at the end of the exclamative:
