THANKFUL

Synonym: relieved We usually use "thankful" when we are relieved that something unpleasant or dangerous didn't happen.

thankful to do something


 Those whose homes were damaged were just thankful to be alive.

thankful for something

 He wasn't badly hurt—that's something to be thankful for.

thankful (that)

- We can only be thankful that there were not more casualties.
- I was thankful that the meeting didn't last long, because I had to get home.







GRATEFUL

Synonym: appreciative We use "grateful" when we want to thank someone because they have given us something or have done something for us.

• Thanks for coming with me. I'm really grateful.

grateful for something

• I'm very grateful for all your help with the party.

grateful to someone for something

 She was grateful to them for letting her stay at their house.



grateful (that)

 You should be grateful that I didn't tell your parents.
