<ul> <li>Colour within the lines</li> <li>To follow the rules or stick to what is expected or conventional.</li> <li>She prefers to colour within the lines at work, avoiding risks or controversial decisions.</li> <li>Artists often find it hard to color within the lines because they crave creative freedom.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Cross the line</li> <li>To go beyond what is acceptable or appropriate.</li> <li>Your comment about her family crossed the line.</li> <li>He likes to joke around, but sometimes he crosses the line without realizing it.</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Draw the line</li> <li>To set a limit on what one is willing to accept or do.</li> <li>I'm willing to work late, but I draw the line at working weekends.</li> <li>You can joke around, but I draw the line at making fun of someone's appearance.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>In line with</li> <li>In agreement or accordance with something; consistent with.</li> <li>His actions were in line with company policies.</li> <li>Her salary increase was in line with her performance and experience.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Read between the lines</li> <li>To understand the hidden or implicit meaning in something, not just the literal words.</li> <li>When she said she was "fine," I tried to read between the lines and sensed something was wrong.</li> </ul>		Somewhere along the line at some moment during a relationship or process: We were close friends during our childhood, but somewhere along the line, we drifted apar
<ul> <li>The bottom line</li> <li>The most important aspect or point; the final outcome or result.</li> <li>The bottom line is that we need more funding to continue the project.</li> <li>You can list all the pros and cons, but the bottom line is whether we can afford it.</li> <li>The bottom line is that we have to make a decision today.</li> </ul>		<ul> <li>Toe the line</li> <li>To conform to rules or authority; to follow instructions strictly.</li> <li>In that company, you have to toe the line if you want to keep your job.</li> <li>He doesn't always agree with the boss, but he toes the line to avoid conflict.</li> <li>The coach expects all players to toe the line during practice.</li> </ul>
