Disappointed

about, at, by, in, that, to, with

ABOUT (sb (not) doing sth)

I'm disappointed about John not coming.
I was disappointed about not getting the job.

AT + inanimate objects (sth basic about the thing)

They're disappointed at the result.
Fans of the original film will be sorely disappointed at this remake.

BY (sb has done sth specific)

I was slightly disappointed by her attitude.
I was disappointed by Susan. She said she'd help me, but she did.

IN (deeper level of disappointment) speaker has lost faith

He's disappointed in his sister. She is always lying to him.
I'm disappointed in the government.

THAT + clause (subject + verb)

She was disappointed that he never replied to her letter.
I was disappointed that we played so well yet still lost.

TO + Verb

We were bitterly disappointed to lose the match.
We were disappointed to find the nightclub closed.

WITH

With + inanimate objects (sth basic about the thing)

We're disappointed with the new car.
I was disappointed with the way he handle the situation.

With + people (state rather than action)

I must say that I was disappointed with his combat capabilities.
I am disappointed with your service.
