It emphasizes that a result is unexpected.**

Despite the fact that.

“Even though” is used when something is always done or a fact is mentioned.

- Even though he never completed college, he runs a successful software company.
- Most of us ignore this good advice, even though we know it to be true.
- I like her, even though she can be annoying at times.

“Even when” is used when something is occasionally done.

- Jessie won't share her toys with me, even when I ask her nicely.
- My parents always treat me well, even when I don't deserve it.
- Even when I talk slowly, she doesn't understand.

EVEN IF

EVEN SO

used to emphasize that something will still be true if another thing happens

- He's determined to prove his innocence, even if he has to go to the highest court in the land.

despite the possibility that; no matter whether.

- Even if you take a taxi, you'll still miss your train.
- I wouldn't tell you, even if I knew.

“Even so” is very much like the word “but” or “however.” “Even so” is different in that it is used with surprising or unexpected results.

- I had a terrible headache, but even so, I went to the concert.
- There are a lot of spelling mistakes; even so, it's quite a good essay.
- The phone system has improved. Even so, there are still very few houses with phones.

We can use if to mean 'even if'

- I'll finish this job if it takes all night.
- I wouldn't marry you if you were the last woman in the world.
