by the extent of

Rosie's teacher was impressed by the extent of her knowledge. (= how much she knew)

the extent of

We don't yet know the extent of his injuries. (= how bad his injuries are).

the extent to which

She had not realized the extent to which the children had been affected. (= the degree to which)

the full/true extent of

The full extent of the damage only became evident the following morning. (= how much damage there was)

to a large/great extent

The complaints were to a large extent valid. (= largely)

to a lesser extent

She was encouraged by her mother and, to a lesser extent, her father. (= not as much)

to an extent

I'm only happy with the job you did to an extent. (= up to a point)

to some/ certain extent

I agree with you to a certain extent, but not entirely. (= to some degree)

to such an extent that

The car was damaged to such an extent that it couldn't be repaired. (= so much that)

to the extent of

He said he didn't like the president, but not to the extent of wanting to kill him. (= so much that)

to the extent that

Sales fell so badly, to the extent that we had to close some of our shops. (= to such a degree that)

to the fullest extent of

He swore to prosecute them to the fullest extent of the law. (= as much as allowed by)
