

EXPRESSING PURPOSE FOR+ -ING TO+ INFINITIVE





FOR +-ING / NOUN

"For + -ing" or "for + noun"are used to explain the purpose of an object - either what it does or how it will be used.

- The architect designed the building for housing offices.
- This knife is **for slicing** vegetables.
- I have one pair of shoes for work and one pair for doing sports.
- She uses her laptop for communication with her colleagues.

To express individual purpose or intention we use to + infinitive.

TO + INFINITIVE

- She is studying to be a lawyer.
- I bought a car to drive to work.
- She uses her phone **to take** photos.
- He went to the store **to buy** some groceries.
- I'm going to Germany to learn German.

- The teacher gave an assignment for the students to practice their writing.
