# ON THE NEWS

We generally say 'in the news' when we want to speak about stories that are happening at the present time and are being discussed in the media.

**be in the news : to be reported about**

- I imagine Donald Trump will be in the news again this week.
- That arrogant football player is always in the news for one reason or another.
- They've been in the news a lot recently because of their marital problems.
- Farming methods are back in the news this week.

We say 'on the news' when talking about the news we see on TV or hear on the radio.

**on the news : in a television or radio broadcast which consists of information about recent events in the country or the world.**

- I saw an interesting report on the 10 o'clock news last night.
- Did you see the Prime Minister on the news?
- My history teacher will be appearing on the news this evening.
- We heard about it on the news on BBC Five Live as we were driving to the game.
