approximately:

- The repair work will cost **in the area of** £200.
- The present value is **in the vicinity of** £120,000.

In the field of something

a subject that you study, or a type of work that you do.

- Knowledge **in the field of** genetics has been developing very rapidly.
- Not only is she advanced **in the field of** literature, she is also a talented artist.
