Phrasal verbs

LOOK

Into sth
to sb/sth

Look into sth (investigate)

To try to find out the truth about a problem, crime etc in order to solve it.

- Police are looking into the disappearance of two children.
- I wrote a letter of complaint, and the airline have promised to look into the matter.
- A working party has been set up to look into the problem.

Look to sb (turn to someone for sth)

(look to someone) to hope or expect to get help, advice etc from someone

look to someone for something:

- As young children, we looked to our parents for guidance.
- He always looked to his father for advice.

look to someone to do something:

- They're looking to me to help improve sales figures.
- The country was looking to him to provide strong leadership.

Look to sth (formal) (consider sth)

to consider something and think about how to make it better

- We need to look to ways of improving our marketing.
- We must look to our defences.

To direct your thoughts or attention to something

- The party needs to look to the future and forget its past problems.
