PREPARE FOR SOMETHING

to make or get someone ready for something that will happen in the future:



- Have you prepared for your interview?
- This course prepares students for middle and senior managerial positions.
- He is working hard preparing for a test.



PREPARE YOURSELF FOR SOMETHING

to expect that something will happen and to be ready for it:



You need to prepare yourself for a long wait.

- The police are preparing themselves for trouble at the demonstration.
- I had been preparing myself for this moment.
- Her condition is not improving as we hoped. You must prepare yourselves for the worst.

BE PREPARED TO DO SOMETHING - idiom

I'm not prepared to listen to excuses.



to be willing to do something:

- I don't mind explaining it to you, but I'm not prepared to do it for you.
- You can see a doctor today, if you're prepared to wait.
- I'm prepared to take legal action if necessary.
