RESULT FROM SOMETHING

phrasal verb

to cause something, or to produce something

- The crash resulted in the deaths of 14 passengers.
- The campaign resulted in significant sales increases.
- A sudden change in temperature will inevitably result in rain.

result in someone/something doing something

 These policies resulted in many elderly people suffering hardship.

phrasal verb

to be caused directly by something that has happened previously

- We are still dealing with problems resulting from errors made in the past.
- The arrests resulted from an anonymous telephone call.
- His difficulty in walking results from a childhood illness.

result from someone/something doing something

 He claimed damages for the losses that resulted from the government cancelling the project.
