

Raise Rise vs

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RAISE : to put something in a higher position or place
/ to increase an amount, number, or level

Raise is a transitive verb, that is, it must have an object.

It is a regular verb; its three forms are raise, raised, raised:

- Raise your hand if you know the answer.
- Our favourite restaurant has raised its prices again. It's getting very expensive.



RISE : to increase in number, amount, or value

Rise is an intransitive verb, that is, it does not take an object. It is an irregular verb; its three forms are rise, rose, risen:

- The sun rose at 5.30 this morning.



- Rents have risen sharply in this part of town.
