In sentences with **THERE + TO BE** (existential there) ,  
we repeat the pronoun **THERE** in the question tag.

<b>BE</b> TAG VERB : BE	There were too many people at the party, <b>weren't there?</b> There is no bread left, <b>is there?</b> There has been a lot of rain so far this month, <b>hasn't there?</b>
<b>USED TO</b> TAG VERB : DID	There used to be a sweet shop in this street , <b>didn't there?</b> There didn't use to be a tree in the garden, <b>did there?</b>
<b>APPEAR</b> TAG VERB : DO	There appears to be some mistake, <b>doesn't there?</b> There appear to be inconsistencies in her alibi, <b>don't there?</b>
<b>SEEM</b> TAG VERB : DO	There seems to be a problem with the radio, <b>doesn't there?</b> There seem to be a lot of people in there, <b>don't there?</b> There don't seem to be any people here, <b>do there?</b> There doesn't seem to be any hot water, <b>does there?</b> There didn't seem to be any differences, <b>did there?</b>
<b>HAPPEN</b> TAG VERB : DO	There happen to be people who agree with me, <b>don't there?</b> There happens to be a pretty barmaid there, <b>doesn't there?</b>
<b>HAVE TO</b> TAG VERB : DO	There doesn't have to be a difference, <b>does there?</b> There just has to be a better way to do it, <b>doesn't there?</b> There has to be something similar over here, <b>doesn't there ?</b>
<b>MUST</b> TAG VERB : MUST	There must be something wrong with my watch, <b>mustn't there?</b>
<b>TURN OUT</b> TAG VERB : DO	There turns out to be a simple solution, <b>doesn't there?</b>
<b>NEED TO</b> TAG VERB : DO	There need to be more women in video games, <b>don't there?</b> There needs to be a properly informed public debate, <b>doesn't there?</b>
