At one time :

In the past, but not now

- At one time, that kind of thing would have made me really angry.

At any moment : very soon

- I'm expecting her to come at any moment.

At the moment : now:

- Sorry, she's not here at the moment.

At the time of :

when something happened

- I was at home at the time of the murder.
- I didn't realize it at the time, but that was the best day of my life.

At this (very) moment : now

- She may be in trouble at this very moment and trying to call you.

For the moment : for now

Well, for the moment we're just friends.

At this time : now / **At that time :** then

- We have no more information available at this time.
- At that time I was eight years old.

From that moment on :

after that time

- From that moment on, I didn't believe a word she said.

**At this¹/that² point in time** (formal):
now¹/then²

- It is impossible to give a definite answer at this point in time.

In the moment :

fully focused on the present time

- Practising any kind of mindfulness helps us to be in the moment.

For a time :

for a short period:

- We were quite happy for a time, until his brother moved in.

For a moment :

for a very short period of time

- He thought for a moment before replying.

For the time being : for now
for a short period of time from now,
but not permanently.

- For the time being, she is living with her father in Madrid.

Of the moment : most important or
popular at the present time

- They interview personalities on a topic of the moment.
