- My briefcase eventually fell to bits.
- The furniture's falling to pieces.





very much or extremely

(British English informal)

- Mark's a darling I love him to bits.
- I love my son to bits.
- I wouldn't be without my cats - I love them to bits.

thrilled/chuffed/pleased to bits

- I've always wanted a car, so I'm thrilled to bits.
- · He was chuffed to bits to learn that he had won.
