THAT'S WHY = THAT IS THE REASON WHY

STATEMENT + THAT'S WHY + CONSEQUENCE/RESULT/EFFECT		
REASON/CAUSE (happened first)	EFFECT (happened after the cause)	
Susan loves you –	that's why she wants to be with you.	
Because she loves you, Susan wants to be with you.		
You are always criticizing her.	That's why she doesn't come here anymore.	
Because you are always criticizing her, she doesn't come here anymore.		
Jennifer's usual train was cancelled.	That's why she's late today.	
Because her usual train was cancelled, Jennifer is late today.		

THAT'S BECAUSE = THE REASON IS THAT

STATEMENT + THAT'S BECAUSE + REASON/CAUSE		
EFFECT (happened after the cause)	REASON/CAUSE (happened first)	
Susan wants to be with you –	that's because she loves you.	
Susan wants to be with you because she loves you.		
She doesn't come here anymore.	That's because you are always criticizing her.	
She doesn't come here anymore because you are always criticizing her.		
Jennifer is late today!	That's because her usual train was cancelled.	
Jennifer is late today because her usual train was cancelled.		

THAT'S WHY vs THAT'S BECAUSE		
Jennifer's usual train was cancelled. CAUSE: Happened first	That's why she's late today. <i>EFFECT: Happened after cause</i>	
First event : her usual train was cancelled	Second event: she is late today	
Jennifer is late today!	That's because her usual train was cancelled.	
EFFECT: Happened after cause	CAUSE : Happened first	
Second event: she is late today	First event : her usual train was cancelled
