Worthwhile

Something that is valuable, important, or beneficial enough to make the effort, time, or energy spent on it worthwhile.

- Volunteering at the animal shelter is really worthwhile; I always leave feeling happy.
- It's worthwhile to study a little every day instead of cramming the night before.

Worth

Indicates that something has a certain value or merit, or that something is useful or important enough to do:

- This painting is worth a lot of money.
- Do you think it's worth going to college?
- Is it worth the risk to invest in that startup?

Worthless : having no value in money, usefulness, or importance; completely lacking worth.

- He said the jewels were worthless fakes.
- He felt worthless after repeatedly failing the exam.

Worth it

Something is worth the effort, cost, or time because the outcome is good or satisfying.

- The hike was tough, but the view from the top was definitely worth it.
- Buying the new laptop is expensive, but it's worth it for the speed and features.

Worthy: Deserving respect, attention, recognition, or effort because of positive qualities or achievements.

- Her dedication makes her worthy of praise.
- This topic is worthy of serious discussion.

Worth one's while

If something is worth one's while, it is beneficial, advantageous, or profitable for someone to do it.

Often used in formal or semi-formal contexts.

- It would be worth your while to attend the workshop; you'll learn a lot of useful tips.
- Negotiating for a higher salary is worth his while, given his experience and performance.

Make it worth one's while

To offer a reward, benefit, or incentive so that someone feels it is valuable to do something.

- I'll make it worth your while if you help me finish this project today.
- The company promised to make it worth her while to relocate to the new office.

Similar phrases with "worth"

It's worth mentioning: Used to indicate that something is important enough to be said.

- *It's worth mentioning that the deadline has been extended.*

Be worth doing: Expresses that an action is valuable or useful.

- *This book is worth reading.*
- *It's worth checking the weather before you leave.*
