Zero article vs definite article for some locations with change in meaning.

If someone is at the place because they are a student / are sick / a prisoner, etc, we don't use **THE**. If they are there for another reason, or we are talking about the building, we use **THE**.

ZERO ARTICLE

RELATIONSHIP TO THAT PLACE



We are going to school.

(=we are students)



I'm going to church.

(=I'm a churchgoer)



I'm in hospital.

(=I'm a patient—I'm sick and being taken care of in a hospital)



She is in prison.

(=She is a prisoner— she committed a crime and is kept in prison as a punishment)

DEFINITIVE ARTICLE: THE

LOCATION



We are going to the school.

(=we are heading to the school building)



I'm going to the church.

(=I'm heading to the church building)



We are in the hospital.

(=We're visiting someone who is in hospital, or we're there for another reason)



She is in the prison.

(=She is visiting someone who is in prison, or she's there for another reason)
