# Advanced comparisons

## than that/those of, from that/those of, to that/those of...

We use **than** when we compare two things or people directly.

Mike is taller than John.

We use **than that/those of** when we compare the characteristics or attributes of those things or people.

### **Examples:**

- Mike's salary is lower <u>than that of</u> John.
- Barclays shares are much better value than those of Lloyds Banking.
- Dogs have a sense of smell that is five times more sensitive <u>than that of</u> humans.

We can also use **from that/those of**, **to that/those of**, etc. to make comparisons.

#### More examples:

- His approach to selling fine china is far superior to that of his competitors.
- These materials have profiles of properties quite different <u>from those of</u> other engineering materials.
