## Attend



“Everybody attended the meeting”

To be present at an event or activity.

- I've voiced my opinion at every meeting I've attended.
- Everyone in the office was expected to attend.
- Thousands of people attended the funeral.

**be VERB-ed + by**

- The meeting will be attended by finance ministers from many countries.

## Attend to



To deal with something or someone.

- There are more pressing matters to be attended to today.
- I may be late – I've got a few things to attend to.
- The staff will helpfully attend to your needs.
- Please take a seat and I'll ask someone to attend to you.
- Are you being attended to, Sir? (= for example, in a shop)

## Key Difference

**Attend** = to be present at something (e.g. a class, meeting, event)

- *I attended the lecture.*

**Attend to** = to take care of or deal with someone/something

- *The nurse attended to the patient.*
