DISINTERESTED

Having no personal involvement or receiving no personal advantage, and therefore free to act fairly:

synonyms :

impartial , neutral.

- Not being involved in the argument, he was able to give a disinterested opinion.
- A lawyer should provide disinterested advice.
- A good referee should be disinterested.
- I was merely a disinterested spectator in the whole affair.

disinterested : not interested
(less common than uninterested)

- Most young people seem disinterested in politics.

UNINTERESTED

Not interested

- I complained to the hotel but they were completely uninterested and unhelpful.

uninterested in:

- She doesn't read newspapers and is uninterested in politics.
- I was and still am totally uninterested in competitive sport.
- Current energy suppliers are largely uninterested in small-scale energy generation.

Common collocations:

ADV. completely, totally, apparently
