



heap

sth on/upon sb

to give someone a lot of praise, criticism, etc.:

- He heaped praise on his team.
- He heaped all the blame on his secretary.
- He deals well with all the criticism heaped on him.

heap sb/sth with sth

- He heaped his team with praise.
- The film has been heaped with praise by critics and audiences alike.

shower

sb with sth

1) to give someone a lot of presents or praise:

- She only sees her niece occasionally, so she showers her with presents when she does.
- His boss showered him with praise.

shower sth on/upon sb

- Susan showered kisses on the baby.

2) Throw (a number of things) all at once towards someone.

- The roof collapsed, showering us with dust and debris.

lavish

sth on sb/sth

to give a lot or too much of something to someone or something:

- She lavishes more attention on that dog than she does on her children.
- She lavishes money on her grandchildren.
- The committee lavished praise on the project.

lavish sb with sth

- He thought he would win her by lavishing her with expensive gifts.
- she lavished our son with kisses'
