disgust	surprise

## **Examples:**

- I actually gave the guy his money back, much to his amazement.
- He agreed to everything, much to my surprise.
- He has never shown any interest in football, much to his father's disappointment.
- Much to my disgust, I found that there were no toilets for the disabled.
- I then realized to my absolute horror, that I had forgotten the present.
- To her chagrin, nobody wanted to hear her sing.
- To our utter despair, the car would not start.
- To my great delight, they said yes.

**NOTE:** We don't usually say "much to your surprise, disgust, etc.", because we don't normally tell others what their emotional reaction is.
